TODAY'S READINGS**First Reading: Deuteronomy 18:15-20**

Moses explains to the people that a prophet will come from among them, and that they should listen to this prophet's words, for God has told him of this prophet. God also tells Moses that anyone who pretends to speak in his words, or speaks in the name of other gods shall die.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 7:32-35

Paul tells the Corinthians how an unmarried man or woman is able to devote themselves fully to God without concern for the needs of a spouse. Paul explains that God wants to help them promote good and devote themselves more fully to God.

Gospel: Mark 1:21-28

As Jesus was teaching, a man with an unclean spirit came to the synagogue and asked if Jesus had come to destroy them. Jesus ordered the spirit out of the man, who shrieked violently as the spirit departed. The people were amazed at the authority he had over the spirit.

HIS WORD TODAY by Rev. William Reilly

"And the Lord said to me: This was well said. I will raise up for them a prophet like you from among your kin, and will put my words into his mouth; he shall tell them all that I command him. Whoever will not listen to my words which he speaks in my name, I myself will make him answer for it. ...All were amazed and asked one another, 'What is this? A new teaching with authority.'"

Maybe we are not accustomed to read the book of Deuteronomy, but we find Moses, the prophet the spokesperson for God, who requested others to speak and the assembly to listen. As we read the Old Testament, we meet many others who responded to God's call, sometimes reluctantly, to speak in His behalf. Can you name some?

Prophetic voices continue to be heard today, as God calls leaders to teach and guide us. There are the well known teachers as the Holy Father, and our local bishops, assuming the role of teacher. There are others who through baptism assume the role of catechists and teachers of the faith. But there are countless others too who speak through their actions, bringing the mercy and message of the Lord to others.

As we begin this New Year may we open our ears to hear the message, our hearts to carry it out, and discover ways the Lord wishes to use us to do His ministry.

LECTURAS DE HOY**Primera Lectura: Deuteronomio 18:15-20**

Moisés explica a la gente que el profeta vendrá de entre ellos, y que deben escuchar sus palabras, ya que Dios les ha hablado de él. Dios también le dice a Moisés que cualquiera que pretenda hablar en vez suya, o hable en el nombre de otros Dioses, morirá.

Segunda Lectura: 1 Corintios 7:32-35

San Pablo le dice a los Corintios cómo un hombre soltero o una mujer soltera pueden dedicarse totalmente a Dios sin tener que considerar las necesidades de un cónyuge. San Pablo explica que Dios desea ayudarlos a promover el bien y dedicarse totalmente a Dios.

Evangelio: San Marcos 1:21-28

Cuando Jesús enseñaba, un hombre con un espíritu impuro vino a la sinagoga y preguntó si Jesús había venido a destruirlos. Jesús le ordenó al espíritu impuro salir del hombre, quien se sacudió violentamente cuando el espíritu salía. La gente estaba sorprendida de la autoridad que Jesús tenía sobre el espíritu.

SU PALABRA HOY por el Rev. William Reilly

Entonces el Señor me dijo: 'Lo que acaban de decir está muy bien. Por eso, suscitaré entre sus hermanos un profeta semejante a ti, pondré mis palabras en su boca, y él dirá todo lo que yo le ordene. Al que no escuche mis palabras, las que este profeta pronuncie en mi Nombre, yo mismo le pediré cuenta.' ... Todos quedaron asombrados y se preguntaban unos a otros: '¿Qué es esto? ¡Enseña de una manera nueva, llena de autoridad.'"

Quizá no estamos acostumbrados a leer el libro de Deuteronomio, pero encontramos a Moisés, el profeta, el portavoz de Dios, quien pidió que otros hablaran y que la asamblea escuchara. Al leer el Antiguo Testamento, encontramos muchos otros que respondieron al llamado de Dios, a veces renuenteemente, para hablar en Su nombre. ¿Puede nombrar algunos?

Las voces proféticas continúan siendo escuchadas hoy, a medida que Dios llama a líderes que nos enseñen y guíen. Están los bien conocidos maestros como el Santo Padre y nuestros obispos locales, asumiendo el papel de educadores. Hay otros que a través del bautismo asumen el papel de catequistas y maestros en la fe. Y hay muchísimos aún que hablan a través de sus acciones, trayendo Misericordia y el mensaje del Señor a otros.

Al comenzar este Año Nuevo, ojalá que abramos nuestros oídos para escuchar el mensaje, nuestros corazones para llevarlo a cabo y que descubramos formas en que el Señor desea utilizarlos para realizar Su ministerio.

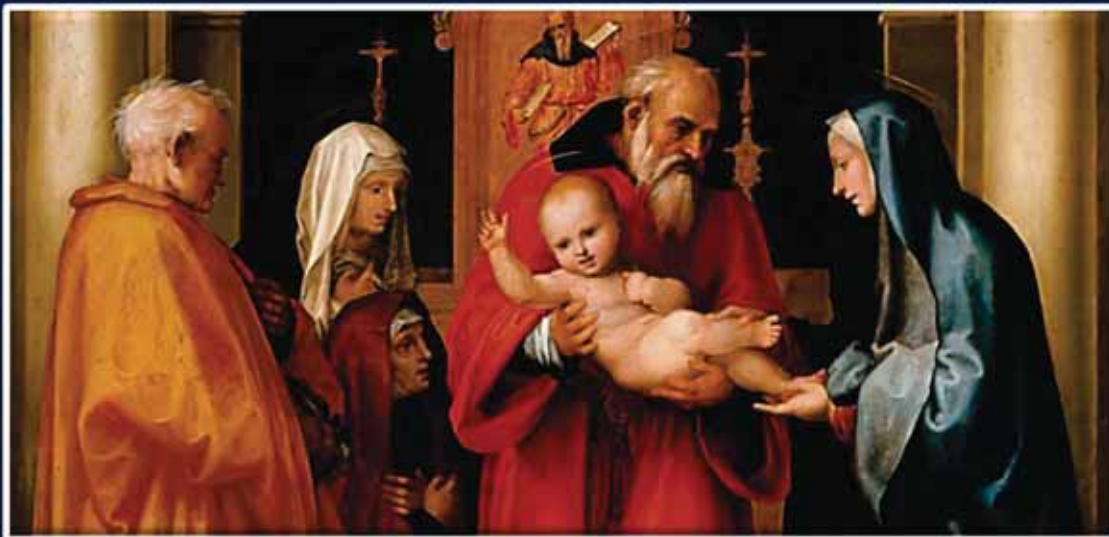
PRAY FOR THE INFIRMED / OREMOS POR LOS ENFERMOS

The Presentation of the Lord

At the end of the fourth century, a woman named Etheria made a pilgrimage to Jerusalem. Her journal, discovered in 1887, gives an unprecedented glimpse of liturgical life there. Among the celebrations she describes is the Epiphany, the observance of Christ's birth, and the gala procession in honor of his Presentation in the Temple 40 days later. (Under the Mosaic Law, a woman was ritually "unclean" for 40 days after childbirth, when she was to present herself to the priests and offer sacrifice—her "purification." Contact with anyone who had brushed against mystery—birth or death—excluded a person from Jewish worship.) This feast emphasizes Jesus' first appearance in the Temple more than Mary's purification.

The observance spread throughout the Western Church in the fifth and sixth centuries. Because the Church in the West celebrated Jesus' birth on December 25, the Presentation was moved to February 2, 40 days after Christmas.

At the beginning of the eighth century, Pope Sergius inaugurated a candlelight procession; at the end of the same century the blessing and distribution of candles which continues to this day became part of the celebration, giving the feast its popular name: Candlemas.

Catechesis for This Week / Categeusis Por Esta Semana

ACTUAL SIN / PECADO REAL

from the *Baltimore Catechism* / del *Catecismo de Baltimore*

What are the chief sources of actual sin?

The chief sources of actual sin are: pride, covetousness, lust, anger, gluttony, envy, and sloth, and these are commonly called capital sins.

Why are these called capital sins?

They are called capital sins, not because they, in themselves, are the greatest sins, but because they are the chief reasons why men commit sin.

What are the near occasions of sin?

The near occasions of sin are all persons, places, or things that may easily lead us into sin.

Did God abandon man after Adam fell into sin?

God did not abandon man after Adam fell into sin, but promised to send into the world a Saviour to free man from his sins and to reopen to him the gates of heaven.

For God so loved the world, that he gave his only-begotten son, that whosoever believeth in him may not perish, but may have life everlasting. (John 3:16)

Who is the Saviour of all men?

The Saviour of all men is Jesus Christ.

For there is one God, and one Mediator between God and men, himself man, Christ Jesus, who gave himself a ransom for all, bearing witness in his own time. (1 Timothy 2:5-6)

What is the chief teaching of the Catholic Church about Jesus Christ?

The chief teaching of the Catholic Church about Jesus Christ is that He is God made man.

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. (John 1:1)

¿Cuáles son las fuentes principales de pecado real?

Las fuentes principales del pecado actual son: orgullo, codicia, lujuria, ira, gula, envidia y pereza, y estos son comúnmente llamados pecados capitales.

¿Por qué se los llama pecados capitales?

Son llamados pecados capitales, no porque ellos, en sí mismos, son los pecados más grandes, sino porque son las principales razones por las cuales los hombres cometen pecados.

¿Cuáles son las ocasiones cercanas de pecado?

Las ocasiones cercanas al pecado son todas las personas, lugares o cosas que fácilmente nos pueden llevar al pecado.

¿Dios abandonó al hombre después de que Adán cayó en pecado?

Dios no abandonó al hombre después de que Adán cayó en pecado, sino que prometió enviar al mundo un Salvador para liberar al hombre de sus pecados y volver a abrirle las puertas del cielo.

Porque tanto amó Dios al mundo, que dio a su hijo unigénito, para que todo aquel que en él cree, no se pierda, sino que tenga vida eterna. (Juan 3:16)

¿Quién es el Salvador de todos los hombres?

El Salvador de todos los hombres es Jesucristo.

Porque hay un Dios, y un Mediator entre Dios y los hombres, él mismo hombre, Cristo Jesús, que se dio a sí mismo en rescate por todos, dando testimonio en su propio tiempo. (1 Timoteo 2: 5-6)

¿Cuál es la principal enseñanza de la Iglesia Católica acerca de Jesucristo?

La principal enseñanza de la Iglesia Católica acerca de Jesucristo es que Él es Dios hecho hombre.

En el principio era la Palabra, y la Palabra estaba con Dios, y la Palabra era Dios. (Juan 1: 1)
