Symbols of Easter / Símbolos de Pascua / Symbole Wielkanocne



Bells: Did You Know?

Bells are another lovely symbol for the day as they are said to have gone to Rome on Maundy Thursday only to have started returning home at [the] Easter Vigil to ring joyfully (in France and Belgium, it is these bells, not the Easter bunny, that bring the Easter eggs).

Butterflies

Butterflies, too, are an apt symbol of the day's meaning. Beginning life as lowly humble caterpillars, they "entomb" themselves in cocoons only to emerge with jewel-colored wings and the ability to soar. What better symbol of the Resurrection -- except maybe for eggs, which had always been symbols of Spring and were items of wonderment to all -- an inanimate object out of which comes life. For Christians, they became the perfect symbol of the tomb Christ conquered, and Jews used (and used) them on their Passover, too, as the Haggadot specifically calls for it as a symbol of rebirth (this is a rabbinical command, not a Scriptural one).

TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading: Acts 4:8-12

Peter explains to the elders that his healing of a cripple was done in the name of Jesus Christ. He reminds the elders that they crucified Jesus, but God rose him up so that all people could be saved in his name.

Second Reading: I John 3:1-2

John expresses amazement at the fact that God allowed us to be called his children. Although we are unsure exactly what we will be after this life, we do know that we will see God as he is and be like him.

Gospel: John 10:11-18

Jesus speaks of a shepherd working only for pay, with no real concern for the sheep being well cared for. But Jesus is our shepherd and would lay down his own life for all those in his flock. God loves him for his willingness to sacrifice himself for the sake of all God's children.

HIS WORD TODAY by Rev. William Reilly

“Peter filled with the Holy Spirit said: ‘Leaders of the people and elders: If we are being examined today about a good deed done to a cripple, namely, by what means he was saved, then all of you and all the people of Israel should know that it was done in the name of Jesus Christ the Nazarean whom you crucified, whom God raised from the dead; in His name this man stands today before you healed... There is no salvation through anyone else.’”

When people inquire where they should begin reading the bible, I suggest a great place is in the Acts of the Apostles, and in particular the kerygmic sermons of Saint Peter and Saint Paul. They are clear and concise statements about Jesus, His passion and resurrection, and through the Spirit are the source of the enthusiasm as the two great preachers tell of their reason for preaching.

It was not much earlier that Peter denied and Paul persecuted those who were curious and seeking. That is what we are about as we reflect on His Word Today and every day – we are desirous of knowing and loving Jesus better, and as we do, we serve as His witness.

The great sermons, the announcement or proclamation give meaning to our lives as disciples and are the call to others to come to Jesus.

LECTURAS DE HOY

Primera Lectura: Hechos 4:8-12

Pedro explica a los ancianos que curó a un lisiado en nombre de Jesucristo. Les recuerda a los ancianos que ellos crucificaron a Jesús, pero que Dios lo resucitó para que todos pudieran ser salvados en su nombre.

Segunda Lectura: 1 Juan 3:1-2

Juan expresa asombro por el hecho de que Dios nos permite llamarnos sus hijos. A pesar de que no estamos exactamente seguros de qué seremos después de esta vida, sabemos que veremos a Dios y que seremos como El.

Evangelio: San Juan 10:11-18

Jesús habla de un pastor trabajando sólo por la paga, sin preocuparse sinceramente en cuidar bien de las ovejas. Pero Jesús es nuestro pastor y daría su vida por cualquier oveja de su rebaño. Dios ama a Jesús por haber permitido sacrificarse por el bien de los hijos de Dios.

SU PALABRA HOY por el Rev. William Reilly

“Pedro, lleno del Espíritu Santo, dijo: ‘Jefes del pueblo y ancianos, ya que hoy se nos pide cuenta del bien que hicimos a un enfermo y de cómo fue curado, sepan ustedes y todo el pueblo de Israel: este hombre está aquí sano delante de ustedes por el nombre de nuestro Señor Jesucristo de Nazaret, al que ustedes crucificaron y Dios resucitó de entre los muertos... Porque no existe bajo el cielo otro Nombre dado a los hombres, por el cual podamos alcanzar la salvación.’”

Cuando la gente pregunta en qué parte deberían empezar a leer la biblia, les sugiero un pasaje excelente en los Hechos de los Apóstoles, y en particular los carismáticos sermones de San Pedro y San Pablo. Hablan de Jesús clara y consisamente, de su pasión y resurrección, y a través del Espíritu son la fuente de entusiasmo por la cual los dos grandes predicadores se dedicaban a evangelizar.

No hacía mucho que Pedro lo había negado y que Pablo perseguía a los seguidores. De eso se trata cuando reflexionamos en Su Palabra Hoy y todos los días: estamos deseosos de conocimiento y de amar mejor a Jesús, y al hacerlo, servimos como Sus testigos.

Los grandes sermones, los anuncios o proclamaciones dan sentido a nuestras vidas como discípulos y son un llamado a otros para acercarse a Jesús.

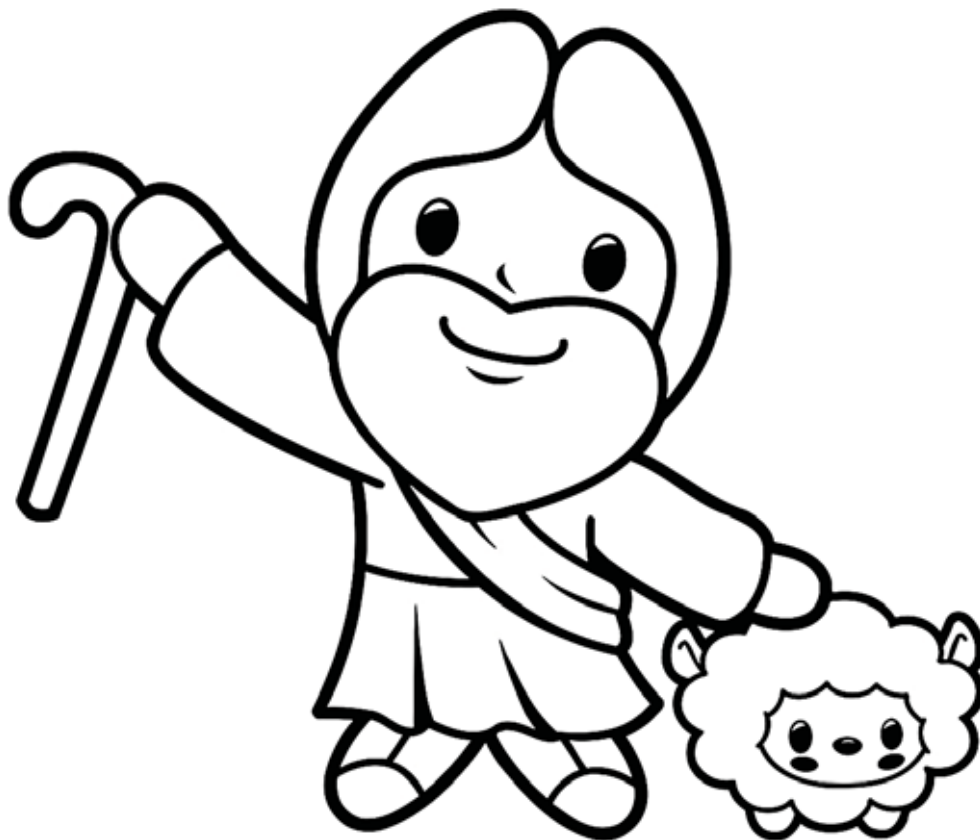
